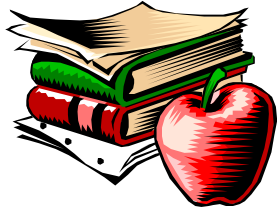

Meditate on The Word (Psalm 1:2; Psalm 119:148)

Cause for Rejoicing (By: Andrew Lacroix – 4/7/11)

“Rejoice in the Lord always; and again I say rejoice.” Philippians 4:4

How many of us each day have a cause for rejoicing? Well, if you're a born-again Christian, you ought to be rejoicing. Every day I have to rejoice because it's another day I can live for the Lord, and so can you.

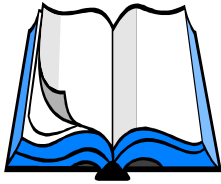
This precious verse of Scripture shows us that despite all the trials the great apostle Paul went through; there was still cause for him to rejoice. I see three areas in which Paul could truly have cause for rejoicing:

Cause for Rejoicing (By: Andrew Lacroix – 4/7/11) (Cont.)

First, he rejoiced in his *salvation*. In Acts 9 we see the once blaspheming, injurious man COMPLETELY changed into a new creature (2 Cor. 5:17). A lot of people can't rejoice in their salvation either because they completely forgot they are saved, whether by trials or temptations, or they have never been born again (John 3:3). Paul had a fresh, new, God-given perspective and just yielded himself to the Lord. Becoming a Christian is a cause for rejoicing.

Next, we see Paul rejoicing in his *service* for Christ. Paul enjoys the blessings (and trials) of the Christian walk as he goes on four separate missionary journeys. Over this time period many souls were saved, baptized, and added to local churches (Acts 2:47). Many Christians were strengthened in God's Word (2 Tim. 2:15) and a few left to plant other N.T. churches or take over struggling, existing candlesticks (Rev. 2). We can experience the same joy no matter what capacity we serve in through our local church. Service for Christ is a cause for rejoicing.

Finally, Paul rejoiced in his eventual *sentence*. During his journeys, Paul had been **stoned** (Acts 14), saw **separation** (Acts 15), been **shackled** (Acts 16) and then **seized** by the unbelieving Jews (Acts 21). They tested and tried him before great men of his time, including Felix (Acts 24), Festus (Acts 25), and King Agrippa (Acts 26). Finally, he was whisked away to appeal unto Caesar (Acts 27 and 28). He was beheaded for the cause of Christ. He went through his entire walk to have a final earthly sentence of death. Unless we are raptured (I Thes. 4:17), Enoch (Gen. 5), or Elijah (2 Kin. 2), we will all face the earthly sentence of death. For the born again Christian and the apostle Paul, our greatest rejoicing will come in our eternal sentence—forever in Heaven with Jesus Christ. No matter what happens in each and every part of our lives, God is in control, reigns supreme, and everything has a divine purpose. Heaven is truly a great cause for rejoicing.

Make today, fellow Christian, a cause for rejoicing.

The Danger of Jealousy (By: Craig Glickman)

Galatians 5:26 tells us to not envy one another. James 3:16 says that where envy and strife is, there is confusion and every evil work! James 4:5 says that the spirit that dwelleth within us lusteth to envy! Deuteronomy 5:21 speaks of desiring and coveting things that are not ours. Envy and jealousy cause us to take our eyes off the Lord and onto self and we are not able to be content with what we have. It causes our hearts to boast of what we want, what we think we need and we can even start blessing those that are covetous, which the Lord abhors (Psalm 10:3, James 3:14)! Prov. 3:31 says “envy thou not the oppressor, and choose none of his ways.” We must be content with what we have and not murmur and complain about what others have. If our heart is sound trusting the Lord to provide all our needs and realizing all we are and have are His, we will be joyful and content in Him and not envying the world and what they have (Psalm 37:7). Envy is the rottenness of the bones and brings no joy (Prov. 14:30)! Proverbs 27:4 says “...who is able to stand before envy?” The answer is NOBODY! Jealousy and envy of others and what others have will cause us to fall into sin and thus break our fellowship with the Lord and we will not be content with what we have. Do you have a problem with jealousy and envy?

How can we get victory over jealousy and envy? We need to consider others needs, be giving, be charitable and desire to focus our hearts and minds on what we can do for others which is pleasing to the Lord (1 Cor. 10:24). In closing, we need to wait patiently for the Lord's will to be done in our lives and not focus on what others have or who they know that is “better than you or I have” (Psalm 37:7).

“He brought me up also out of a horrible pit, out of the miry clay, and set my feet upon a rock, and established my goings. And he hath put a new song in my mouth, even praise unto our God; many shall see it, and fear, and shall trust in the Lord.” Psalm 40: 2-3

Last December I was playing the outdoor sport Frisbee golf. It is played like ball golf except you throw Frisbees into chain-link baskets. While searching for an errant throw in about three inches of snow, I felt the soft ground give way and I could not muster the strength to get out. Somehow or another I was in the marsh. I was not sinking, but I could not get out without assistance. Thankfully I was playing with two other men that day, and it took both men and my own remaining power to get out of the cold, swampy, snow covered marsh and place my feet on more solid ground (we did find the Frisbee though). Without the help of these two men I may have been there for a while.

I find salvation to be the same way. Although our text highlights a key portion of David’s prayer, I see it as salvation and the reminder of our Christian lives. Before we are saved, we are all in horrible pits. The most horrible pit imaginable is the everlasting lake of fire (Revelation 20:15), and hell its predecessor, prepared for the devil and his angels (Matthew 25:41). Well before these are the horrible pits of the average life. Life without Christ is like being in a horrible pit and unable to get out on our own. The Bible speaks of salvation in Ephesians 2:8: “For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God”. Many like to think that our self-righteousness will be good enough for heaven, but Isaiah said otherwise in calling our righteousness as filthy rags (64:6). Jesus said in John 14:6: “I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life; no man cometh unto the Father but by me.” A horrible pit is the same thing as miry clay. If you fell into a well several feet down, even avoiding injury, can you get out on your own? More than likely not. You will need to cry out for help. God is the One to whom we cry out for salvation. Romans 10:13 says “For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.” Come truly repentant and truly believing and He will bring you out of the horrible pit and the miry clay.

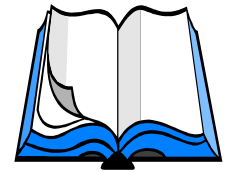
He does not stop there though. He will set our feet upon a rock and establish our goings. When I was lifted from the cold marsh that December day, I was not set back in the marsh, but on more solid ground. God will not let us go back to that horrible pit again; rather we will be established on the Solid Rock, Christ (I Corinthians 10:4). Upon a Rock was His church established (Matthew 16:18) and where the wise man built his house (Matthew 7:24-25). Jeshurun forsook his Rock and esteemed it lightly (Deuteronomy 32:15). Goings is often translated as steps. Our steps will no longer be our own; but God, the Rock of our salvation, will move us in the right direction in our Christian lives.

We do not sing the old songs of the old creature once we are saved. We are new creatures (II Corinthians 5:17); therefore, the Lord will give us a new song in our mouths. These will not be songs of lament and sorrow, but rather a “joyful noise” (Psalm 95:1). These are songs of praise, which will cause men to “see it, and fear, and shall trust in the Lord.” Paul and Silas’ singing in the jail led to an earthquake, and the trembling Philippian jailor asked, “Sirs, what must I do to be saved?” (Acts 16:30) Paul said, “Speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord.” (Ephesians 5:19)

My friend, if God has brought you out of the horrible pit, He has no doubt set your feet upon the Rock, established your goings, and you should respond with overflowing songs of His praise which will draw men not to you, but to Christ.

In conclusion, what God did for us should drive us to sing His praises, which will bring lost men unto Him. Our song can be something like this:

My hope is built on nothing less than Jesus’ blood and righteousness; no merit of my own I claim; but wholly lean on Jesus’ name. On Christ the Solid Rock I stand; all other ground is sinking sand; all other ground is sinking sand.

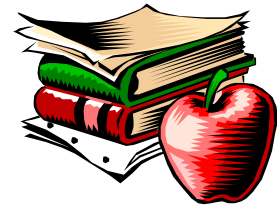
